

Elkhart County Parks Legacy Fund

In 2019, staff and visitors were devastated by the loss of gate attendant Catherine Metzger. She was a quiet and friendly person who loved animals and nature, and always greeted visitors with a smile. Cathy had been a teacher for many years in the Elkhart Community Schools. She later became an Indiana Master Naturalist and loved exploring the region with outdoor loving friends.

Cathy was full of ideas and eager to help assist with Nature Nuts or Book Club and always wondered how we could 'do things better' in the parks with repairs and programs. She often surprised fellow staff with little thank you notes.

She left not only good memories, but left the Elkhart County Parks a major surprise. In 2020, we accepted an unrestricted gift from Cathy's estate and the Park Board made the decision to create the Elkhart County Parks Legacy Fund in 2021 with the almost \$200,000 donation which was matched with \$50,000 by the Community Foundation of Elkhart County.

This spirit of planning for the future to assist with programs and projects fell in line with Cathy's vision. Cathy's gift will be perpetual to the Elkhart County



Parks and is one last seed she was able to plant to connect people to nature. We will forever be grateful to her and those who help grow the Legacy Fund in the future.

Partnerships

- The Elkhart County Soil and Water Conservation District continues to be a partner as we assist with the Indiana Master Naturalist program.
- The Midwest Museum of American Art featured an exhibit entitled "A Walk in the Woods" that displayed landscape paintings from their collection. We partnered with them to provide several programs and they encouraged participants to enjoy forests in local parks.
- The Elkhart County Convention and Visitors Bureau continues to be an important partner by sponsoring the Quilt Garden at the Elkhart County Historical Museum and Quilt Mural at Bonneyville Mill. In addition we appreciate the Michiana Master Gardeners great care they give to planting and maintaining the quilt garden.
- Many staff worked with WNIT to highlight the documentary "Then, Now, and Always...the St. Joe River Story." The Elkhart County Historical Museum featured a virtual on-line series of photos entitled "Work and Play along the St. Joe" while naturalist staff helped create an activity guide for families and St. Joe River Bioblitz that identified 427 different specimens of flora and fauna in the river ecosystem. Staff also continued to be featured on WNIT's "Outdoor Elements."

- Staff and volunteers participated in the "Summer Bat Roost Monitoring Project" sponsored by the Indiana Department of Natural Resources. We also continued to partner with the IDNR to help care for Lieber Nature Preserve in Bristol.
- Museum curators and volunteers continue to process and catalog collections for the Elkhart County Historical Society and uploaded materials into the Indiana Memory database so that researchers have access to more than 8,000 historic images online.
- Staff partnered with Goshen Health and Goshen Community Schools for their Summer Lunch Bunch program to provide health related programs while area children ate lunches at select locations.
- The Community Foundation of Elkhart County and Vibrant Communities hosted a series of Pathways and Trails stakeholder meetings. They have hired a private firm to work with communities and trail non-profits to create a network called 'Connect in Elkhart County' and to develop a future trail master plan. connectinelkhartcounty.com
- For more than three decades, we continued to host an education booth at the Elkhart County 4H Fair and this year we expanded the native garden around the building.

PEOPLE & PROGRAMS

The department began the year with the continuation of virtual and outdoor programs in limited numbers. As 2021 passed and immunity of the community was built, we were able to open our doors to more programs and even brought back a few special events. In addition, the Elkhart County Historical Museum started working with Beacon Health, City of Elkhart, and area libraries to collect pandemic stories for future generations.



Crossroads Exhibit Wins Award for Historical Museum



PRESERVATION OF SPACES

Land and Water Conservation Funds Released to Build Future Park

The progress of building Corson Riverwoods County Park was slowed by the pandemic, but the pace picked up in 2021. The planning and engineering of this future park north of Middlebury is for land donated by Mr. Tom Corson. With funds for development now released, look for a new park in the near future. 
Feasibility Study of River Preserve Dams

The Elkhart County Parks used an IDNR LARE (Lake and River Enhancement) grant to study the impact of river restoration via possible removal and/or modification of the Baintertown and Benton Dams in the River Preserve County Park. The study included three public meetings and pros and cons of removal including recreation safety risks and opening the river up for fish and other aquatic animals such as mollusks.

Toe Drain Repair at Goshen Dam

Elkhart County Commissioners assisted the Park Board with the repair of the toe drain at the Goshen Dam. The toe drain is a pipe that collects seepage in the earthen dam and is important to maintain the safety and security of this high hazard dam.





River Preserve retro travel-style shirts debuted

The sale of the fundraising shirts on bonfire.com has netted around \$2,500 so far for the Friends of the **Elkhart County** Parks. This is the fourth park in the series of 'vintage art' completed.



Two Brochure Updates
